

Commander Oudrey Hervey



Commander Hervey, a native of Clarksdale, Miss., was commissioned in December 1992 after completing Navy Reserve Officer Training Corps, Southern University and was first assigned to USS *Jarrett* (FFG 33) as the Anti-Submarine Warfare Officer and subsequently served as the Electrical Officer. In June 1996, he reported to NRD St. Louis where he was assigned as an Officer Recruiter. In August 1998, Commander Hervey reported to Recruit Training Command Great Lakes where he served as a Ship's (Barracks) Officer and Public Affairs Officer. In August 2001, he reported to Navy Personnel Command, Millington, Tenn., where

he was assigned as a Joint Officer Manager and Placement Officer, Joint Forces Staff College. Commander Hervey later served as Commander, Tampa Military Entrance Processing Station from September 2004 to June 2007. In 2007 he reported to OPNAV staff (N3/N5) as an action officer. Subsequently, in 2011 Commander Hervey completed a student tour at Naval War College. Commander Hervey was assigned as the commanding officer, NRD Houston in May 2013.

Commander Hervey earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Electronics Engineering from Southern University, Baton Rouge, La., in December 1992, a Master of Science degree in Public Service from DePaul University, Chicago, in June 2001 and a masters in National Strategy and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College, Newport, R.I., in 2011. Commander Hervey is a designated Joint Qualified Officer whose professional military education includes Surface Warfare Officer School, Anti-Submarine Warfare Officer School, Naval Justice School, Navy Recruiting Leadership Academy, and Command Leadership School. He has proven subspecialties in Anti-Submarine Warfare and Manpower Analysis.

Commander Hervey's personal military awards and decorations include the Surface Warfare Officer Pin, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, two Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medals, three Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals and the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal.
